Washington, DC - July 8, 2008 – Today in Washington, DC and 52 cities across the country, including 38 state capitals, a new national campaign is bringing together millions of Americans to demand quality, affordable health care for all. Health Care for America Now (HCAN) is being launched by more than 100 national and state-based groups that represent labor, community organizations, doctors, nurses, women, small businesses, faith-based organizations, people of color, netroots activists, and think tanks. Health Care for America Now is organizing to assure that the first order of business of the next President and Congress is to pass legislation in 2009 that guarantees quality, affordable health care for all.

Health Care for America Now is an unprecedented coalition led by ACORN, AFSCME, Americans United for Change, Campaign for America's Future, Center for American Progress Action Fund, Center for Community Change, MoveOn.org, National Education Association, National Women's Law Center, Planned Parenthood Federation of America, SEIU, United Food and Commercial Workers, and USAction.

"The heart and soul of our campaign lies outside the Beltway where millions of Americans are mobilizing at work, at home, in their neighborhoods, and online to win quality, affordable health care we all can count on," says Richard Kirsch, National Campaign Manager for Health Care for America Now.

Starting today, the campaign is spending an initial \$1.5 million on national television, print, and online advertising and is sending out an email blast to more than 5 million people. Over the next five months, Health Care for America Now plans to spend \$25 million in paid media, have 100 organizers in 45 states, and will be asking Members of Congress, "Which side are you on?"

"HCAN will mobilize millions of Americans to demand that the first order of business of the next President and Congress is to enact quality, affordable health care for all in 2009," said Kirsch. "We will be asking Members of Congress this year to tell us if they are on our side or the side of the health insurance industry."

Health Care for America Now offers a bold new vision for health care reform: Americans can keep the private insurance they have, join a new private insurance plan, or choose a public health insurance plan. The campaign also calls for a government role in setting and enforcing rules on the insurance industry which consistently charges whatever it wants, sets high deductibles, denies coverage based on pre-existing conditions, and drops coverage when people get sick.

"It is time the insurance industry started putting our health before its profits," says Kirsch. "We need an American solution to health care that offers quality, affordability, and choice. We need a solution that works for our families and our businesses, and now is the time to make sure the next President and Congress deliver on the promise of quality, affordable health care for all in 2009."

Health Care for America Now started with a financial commitment of at least \$500,000 from each of the 13 steering committee members and a \$10 million grant from The Atlantic Philanthropies, a foundation which supports projects to improve health care in the U.S, improve the lives of children, youth and older adults, and support human rights.

"Regardless of health status, income, race, age or any other factor, every person deserves quality, affordable health care," said Gara LaMarche, President and CEO of The Atlantic Philanthropies. "We support Health Care for America Now's effort to build a groundswell of support to make sure the next President and Congress deliver on the promise of quality, affordable health care for all in 2009."
